

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMON COUNCIL

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2022

The regular monthly meeting of the Common Council of the City of Weyauwega was called to order at 6:30 p.m., on Monday, September 19, 2022 in the Weyauwega Municipal Building Council Chambers by Mayor Jack Spierings.

Roll Call: Present: Mayor Jack Spierings, Rich Luedke, Kaley DuCoeur, Chris Gunderson, Bruce Goetsch, Cameron Looker, and Tim Litscher. Also present: City Administrator Jeremy Schroeder, Clerk Rebecca Loehrke, Police Chief Brandon Leschke, Frank Zabojski, Richard Rupno, and Scott Jarchow. The meeting began with the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance led by Cameron Looker.

*Motion Luedke, second Looker, to approve the agenda. Motion carried with six "ayes", zero "nays".*

*Motion Luedke, second Goetsch, to approve the minutes of the Regular Common Council Meeting from August 15, 2022 and the Special Common Council from August 29, 2022. Motion carried with six "ayes", zero "nays".*

**Citizen Appearances**: Library Representative, Frank Zabojski, reported that the library found out that what they thought were two floor drains are actually not drains at all. He has met with the engineer to see what is needed for a sprinkler system in the library with the future expansion project. The Library Board has also submit paperwork to the Wohlt Foundation. Hoping to find out by the end of the month if they will receive any funding. Also, the elevator is working good at this time. It was recently inspected and in working order.
